CERTIFICATE OF ORDINANCE

I, the undersigned, do hereby certify that I am the duly appointed, qualified and acting Village Clerk of the Village of Mackinaw, Tazewell County, Illinois (the "Issuer"), and as such official I am the keeper of the records and files of its President and Board of Trustees (the "Corporate Authorities").

I do further certify the foregoing constitutes a full, true and complete excerpt from the proceedings of the regular meeting of the Corporate Authorities held on the 14th day of May, 2012, insofar as same relates to the adoption of Ordinance No. 844, entitled:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE VILLAGE OF MACKINAW MUNICIPAL CODE SAID MUNICIPAL CODE BEING ORDINANCE NO. 513 OF THE VILLAGE OF MACKINAW ADOPTING HIRING STANDARDS FOR PART-TIME POLICE OFFICERS.

A true, correct and complete copy of which ordinance (the "Preliminary Ordinance" or "Ordinance") as adopted at such meeting appears in the transcript of the minutes of such meeting. The Preliminary Ordinance was adopted and approved by the vote and on the date therein set forth.

I do further certify the deliberations of the Corporate Authorities on the adoption of such Preliminary Ordinance were taken openly and was on the agenda at least 48 hours before the meeting at which it was adopted, that the adoption of such ordinance was duly moved and seconded, that the vote on the adoption of such ordinance was taken openly and was preceded by a public recital of the nature of the matter being considered and such other information as would inform the public of the business being conducted, that such meeting was held at a specified time and place convenient to the public, that notice of such meeting was duly given to all of the news media requesting such notice, that such meeting was called and held in strict compliance with the provisions of the Open Meetings Act of the State of Illinois, as amended, and the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended, and that the Corporate Authorities have compiled with all of the applicable provisions of such Act and such Code and their procedural rules in the adoption of such ordinance.

The pamphlet form of *Ordinance No.844*, including the ordinance and a cover sheet thereof, was prepared and a copy of such Ordinance was posted for public inspection in the municipal building, the Mackinaw United States Post Office, and the Mackinaw Library commencing on *May 14, 2012* and continuing for at least ten days thereafter. The original ordinance was adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Mackinaw at a regular meeting, attended by six members of the Board, and approved by the President, as said Ordinance appears on file in my office and as the same is recorded in the Book of Ordinances of said Village.

Ordinance No. 844

The VILLAGE OF MACKINAW, Illinois, pursuant to Illinois Compiled Statutes Chapter 65, Section 5/3.1-30-21 ordains to adopt hiring standards for part-time police officers.

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Mackinaw, Tazewell County, Illinois, as follows:

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted a revision to the Illinois Municipal Code requiring that municipalities employing part-time police officers shall, by ordinance, establish hiring standards for part-time police officers and shall submit those standards to the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Mackinaw, Tazewell County, Illinois, wish to maintain compliance with the Illinois statutory mandate as aforesaid;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Mackinaw, Tazewell County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Part-Time Police

- A. Employment The Village of Mackinaw may employ part-time police officers from time to time as they deem necessary.
- B. <u>Duties</u> A part-time police officer shall have all the responsibilities of a full-time police officer and such specific duties as delineated in the General Orders of the Mackinaw Police Department, but the number of hours a part-time officer may work within a calendar year is restricted. Part time police officers shall not be assigned to supervise or direct full-time police officers. Part-time police officers shall be trained in accordance with the Illinois Police Training Act (50 ILCS 705/1 et. Seq.) and the rules and requirements of the ILETSB.
- C. <u>Hiring Standards</u> Any person employed as apart-time police officer must meet the following standards:
 - Be of good moral character, of temperate habits, of sound health, and physically and mentally able to perform assigned duties.
 - 2. Be at least twenty-one (21) years of age.
 - 3. Pass a medical examination.
 - 4. Possess a high school diploma or GED certificate.
 - 5. Possess a valid State of Illinois driver's license.
 - 6. Possess no prior felony convictions.
 - Any individual who has served in the U.S. military must have been honorably discharged.

- D. <u>Discipline</u> Part-time police officers shall be under the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Chief of Police. Part-time police officers serve at the discretion of the Village authorities, shall not have any property rights in said employment, and may be removed by the Village authorities at any time. Part-time police officers shall comply with all applicable rules and General Orders issued by the Police Department.
- E. <u>Training</u> All part-time police officers must be trained in accordance with the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board.

Section 2. That if any section, paragraph, clause, phase or part of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance, and the application of these provisions to any person or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

Section 3. All ordinance or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as they conflict herewith.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage as provided by law.
